Heirs of Rev. JOHN COWARD, Deceased.

Having been empowered by nearly two hundred heirs, as their attorney, after making full searches in England, and ascertaining all the facts in the premises, I report as I find it:—

Ist. I find a valuable property at Salford and Huim, left by William Chapterd to the church and academy he was founder of, by will, of which I have a copy. I found property going to decay, schools done away with church and faith not kee up, hared rested out for work hop, family up stairs; the trustees have not curried out his will, the store it is suil. Individe, The heirs of Rev. John Coward, the only claiments to the property, can be proven by searches, and getting the connecting link between William and Hugh, which can be easily got in England. By appearance of the will, I believe the have been altered to suit the trustees, recorded, and genuine will destroyed—such is the opinion of parties: trustees indifferent, and hot inclined to give any information. I believe their trust can be broken, and the property recovered, as we can connect our family direct to Hugh.

2d. I further made full search in Chancery and Chambers, to ascertain if any order, as appointment, had been recorded, for any one to act as trustee for the heirs in America; found no record of any kind connected with the Coward estate, no claims entered, and is not in Chancery. Finding no more could be done according to the will, without farther searches connecting William to Hugh, I return home for want of me and to make such. The will not as expected; if it had been as reported, would have been in full possession now. The only way the property can be recovered, is the way above mentioned.

Since arriving in New York, myself and a friend of the belra had an interview with D. W. Hendrickson, to give him an opportunity to show some light as to his authority for advertisement of trusteeship, as there was no record in Chancery of such appointment, deeming it right and proper to do so before reporting.

I therefore inform the heirs hat I have thoroughly examined all his papers and letters received by him from Mr. Sawyer, his attorney, and find them genuine and correct, with proper stamps and seals affixed by the courts they came from, and mailed by Mr. Sawyer to Red Bank, New Jersey, with English post stamps on them; also, papers showing the changing of names by the family, and searches made by Sawyer, a barrister of the Queens Bench, in getting the genealogy and councering link, which are all stamped. Also, examined a permit, or coasent of the Court of Chancery, for him to advertise for the heirs, to get their authority for appointing him trustee, by his filing bonds in Chancery. This not being an order or appointment in full, and no bonds filed, it was not recorded. Sawyer getting this permit for o advertise, advertised in this way to bring in the heirs more speedily and get the appointment for D. W. Hendrickson, and make out the case, and file in court the claims, and displace those trustees by suthority of Chancery.

Through this advertisement all were misled. Supposing the appointment actually given a fraud, (which was not the case), this misunderstanding, not knowing the facts, has caused all the trouble, D. W. Hendrickson, not having full searches and connections of the families until 1869, the will not invorable, said he did not know what to tell, and kept all in mystery; and he not informing any one of the facts, the heirs supposed he intended to defror 1 them; and after he getting all connections so he could explain, they were in full force acting spains; him, not knowing the facts, anpposed they were right in contending for their own; he, finding them opposing him, declined to inform them, unless they signed his powers. False reports and misunderstandings on both sides made the breach wider, until the heirs determine I to know by sending some one. Therefore, if he had explained and the facts been known, this trouble would be avoided. Not knowing the true situation myself until after getting in England, I believed as others did—his not telling the facts.


I believe this property can be recovered by us, by getting the connecting link, which link D. W. Hendrickson has already got, at an expence to himself. It is right he should carry the matter through. The difficulty was caused between him and the heirs solely through misunderstanding. I am satisfied he meant nothing wrong, and will do what is right. This will reads the same as mine, and those persons who read it were certainly nuistaken in its reading. Mr. D. W. Hendrickson is willing to set all falseboods right. I shall feel pleased if I can be the means of settling this difficulty, and bringing all together, as friends should be. I saw daplicate drafts of money sent to Sawyer and others, in England, amounting to nearly \$2,000; and as the link is connected by D. W. Hendrickson in England, that I will be able to connect the link in this country between the heirs and D. W. Hendrickson.




New Jersey Discontinued Post Offices

MILLSTONE - Somerset County - 1800-1971








New Jersey Discontinued Post Offices

DECKERTOWN - Sussex County - 1815-1901









New Jersey Discontinued Post Offices
